2013 FACTS

PROGRAMS

PolioPlus. Since 1985, Rotary members have helped immunize more than 2 billion children against polio. Today, all but three countries are free of polio, and 134 of them are certified polio-free, meaning they've reported no cases of polio for three years. As of June 2013, Rotary had committed more than \$1.2 billion to global polio eradication to ensure that polio is eliminated in the last three countries where it remains and does not return to others. **In 2012-13, program awards, including PolioPlus Partners grants, totaled \$73.6 million.**

Rotary Peace Fellowships. Each year, the Foundation funds up to 100 fellows to study at six Rotary Peace Centers. Fellows earn master's-level degrees or professional development certificates. Since 2002-03, 769 fellows from more than 110 countries have participated at a cost of \$44.3 million. **In 2012-13, 92 Rotary Peace Fellows from 44 countries began studies at the Rotary Peace Centers. Program awards totaled \$4.9 million.**

New Grant Model pilot. Beginning in July 2010, 100 districts around the world participated in a three-year pilot of a new grant structure. District grants support smaller-scale projects related to the Foundation's mission. Global grants support humanitarian projects, scholarships, and vocational training teams in Rotary's areas of focus. Packaged grants also support the areas of focus and are carried out with the Foundation's strategic partners. **In 2012-13, the Foundation approved 96 district grants totaling over \$5.3 million, 272 global grants totaling \$12.1 million, and 7 packaged grants totaling \$0.6 million.**



Matching Grants. Since 1965, the Foundation has funded 37,499 Matching Grant projects in over 200 countries at a cost of more than \$503 million. **In 2012-13, the Foundation approved 1,878 grants in 109 countries. Program awards totaled \$39.4 million.**

District Simplified Grants. Since the program began in 2003-04, 3,755 grants have been awarded to over 500 districts at a cost of \$62.5 million. **In 2012-13, the Foundation approved 358 grants awarded to districts in 48 countries. Program awards totaled \$6.3 million.**

Ambassadorial Scholarships. Since 1947, the Foundation has given scholarships to 41,732 scholars from over 130 countries at a cost of over \$560 million. **In 2012-13, 347 scholars from 217 districts were hosted by 155 districts worldwide. Program awards totaled \$9.2 million.**

Group Study Exchange. Since 1965, more than 72,600 people (15,380 teams) from 106 countries have participated at a cost of more than \$119 million. **In 2012-13, 374 teams traveled abroad. Program awards totaled \$3.2 million.**



*Beginning in 2008, contributions include grants for polio eradication from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation. 2012-13 contributions include \$5.4 million received from Rotary International.
